AFFIDAVIT FOR PROBABLE CAUSE

I **Detective Sgt. Jesus Monarrez**, an officer with the Dubois County Sheriff's Department being first duly sworn upon his oath, states under the penalties of perjury, that he/she believes and has good cause to believe that on or about the **24** day of **September**, 20 **20** at and in the County of Dubois, State of Indiana, the above named person committed the crime(s) of **Resisting Law Enforcement with a vehicle, resisting law enforcement (physical), Reckless Driving** in violation of I.C. **35-44.1-3-1 Level 6, 35-44.1-3-1 Amisd. 9-21-8-52 A misd.** and the affiant's beliefs are based on the following information, facts and circumstances, to-wit:

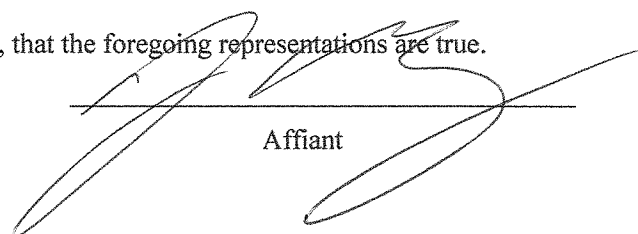
On 09/24/2020 around 10:00am. I overheard radio traffic from Indiana State police in reference to a subject having some sort of metal, and physical issue. The subject was last seen in Spencer County. The subject pulled over for first responders, but then took off in a high rate of speed in a red utility truck. The subject had told medical staff that he had swallowed a fishhook. The last information I heard from State Police was that he was northbound on SR. 162 from the town of Santa Claus. The subject had been in a clinic in Bristol, but when medical staff tried to help him, he freaked out and ran out of their office.

I was continuing southbound on SR. 162 and County Rd. 700 S. when I saw a red utility truck traveling over 90 mph. After the vehicle passed me, I turned around and initiated the lights and sirens on my police vehicle. The vehicle continued north bound at speeds varying from 70mph to 95mph. The vehicle was traveling recklessly almost colliding with other vehicles several times. At one point the vehicle almost hit a semi head on. At other times the vehicle ran other vehicles off the road. The vehicle continued northbound into Jasper City limits. There were several officers with lights and sirens traveling in opposite southbound attempting to stop the vehicle. The vehicle disregarded all emergency vehicles and continued northbound at a high rate of speed, without regard for anybody else. The area was getting very congested with traffic, and the vehicle came to a sudden stop. The driver of the vehicle jumped out of the driver side door.

The driver began stabbing himself in the mouth with a piece of wire. I ran over to the subject and attempted to place him in custody. The subject became combative and appeared to be under the influence of something. The subject continued to kick at

officers and kept resisting. The subject was sweaty, clammy and kept screaming uncontrollably. I had the other officers call for an ambulance. While we waited for the ambulance, the subject was eventually placed in handcuffs, and shackles. The subject continued to resist and scream. The subject was identified as John R. Carter. Carter was eventually placed in the back of an ambulance and had to be restrained by multiple officers. Once we arrived at the hospital, Memorial Medical Staff had to sedate Carter with medication due to his combativeness. Memorial Medical staff kept Carter in their facility for further evaluation. The vehicle was returned back to its owner, whom Carter worked for.
